### BALLERINA MAKES THE CUT

An 11-year-old ballerina from Ickenham has been selected from hundreds of young hopefuls from 63 different countries to win a place at the world famous Royal Ballet School – the same place where Darcey Bussell started her career!

Jasmine Whitford (*right*), a pupil at Breakspeare Junior School, has attended Suzanne's School of Dance in the village since she was just two, and now attends six classes every week there. It was Suzanne Ware's daughter, Rachel, herself a member of the Royal Ballet, who recommended Jasmine should apply for the audition with them.

And a thorough 'audition' it turned out to be! The first stage was held at the Royal Ballet School in Covent Garden, where, in a group of other hopefuls, Jasmine was required to demonstrate several different ballet positions for an hour, carefully observed by three judges. The final audition was at the legendary White Lodge in Richmond Park. During her day there Jasmine had to complete a written assessment, undergo an interview and another dancing session, this time in the studio named after one of the most famous classical ballet dancers of all time, Margot Fonteyn!

Two days later, Jasmine was told that in September she will start her full-time schooling at White Lodge! The agenda there is rigorous; 4 hours of National Curriculum education weekday mornings and 4 hours of ballet in the afternoons. And she will be appraised every year to ensure she continues to make the high grade demanded.

"We are delighted that Jasmine has got this opportunity", said her proud parents, "but she has earned it through her hard work and dedication. We are fortunate too that Jasmine has been granted an Arts Council bursary to help with the considerable costs of the schooling and now we are so excited that we just can't wait for her to start at White Lodge!" The school provides full board but Jasmine expects to spend her weekends at home – at least for the time being.

“I will miss my friends at Breakspear”, said Jasmine, “but they are very happy for me having this opportunity. I know it’s going to be hard work at the Royal Ballet but I really believe I can become a prima ballerina one day – just like Darcey Bussell!”

## DREAMING SPIRES INSPIRE GLEBE PUPILS

Pupils from Glebe Primary School in Ickenham enjoyed a day of inspiration at Oxford University recently. The pupils from Year 6, pictured outside the iconic ‘dreaming spires’ of the English Faculty’s Bodleian Library, visited Christ Church College touring the famous college buildings where past students have included former Prime Minister Anthony Eden, Albert Einstein and the writer of Alice in Wonderland, Lewis Carroll. The children, having read the book in school, were able to learn more about how Lewis Carroll was inspired to write the Alice books and saw some of the locations that he used in the story.

“We have high aspirations for all of our children,” said head teacher Nick Alford. “We use this trip to inspire the children to aim high in the future. We make it clear to all of the children that they too could make it to Oxford or another top university or secure a good job, if they continue to work hard.”

One of Glebe's former pupils, Beth Kume, who is currently studying at Oxford University, visited the children and told them about life at Oxford and many are now determined to follow in her footsteps in the future.

“I’m sure,” said Mr Alford, “experiences such as this are both raising aspiration and standards in the school. With this positive attitude and high ambition amongst staff and pupils it's no wonder that Glebe was ranked in the top 1,000 schools for achievement.”

## FELICITY’S LETTER TO YOU

Dear Friends,

June 21st brings the summer solstice, when the sun reaches its farthest point north of the equator. This marks the ‘official’ beginning of summer, and is the day with the most hours of sunlight during the whole year. The word ‘solstice’ itself comes from the Latin word *solstitium*: *sol* being sun, and *stitium* meaning to stop, reflecting the fact that the Sun appears to stand still in the sky.

I wonder how many of you will know that the sun stood still in the sky for a whole day as Israel entered the Promised Land? Joshua and his army first marched on Jericho and Ai, winning the battles and taking the land that God had promised them. Unsurprisingly the other local kings joined forces to resist Joshua’s advance – all, that is, except the Gibeonites, who decided to seek a peace treaty.

Adoni-Zedek, the king of Jerusalem, begged the other kings to join him in attacking the Gibeonites for their supposed treachery in siding with Joshua. In turn the Gibeonites sent for Joshua and the Israelite army to defend them, and Joshua prayed to God: “Sun, stand still over Gibeon, and you, moon, over the valley of Aijalon.” And God heard, for the sun stopped in the middle of the sky and delayed going down for a full day. Joshua 10:14 declares that “there has never been a day like it, before or since, a day when the Lord listened to a human being. Surely the Lord was fighting for Israel.”



Joshua was obedient to God, doing his best to listen, to hear and to follow. When Joshua called out in prayer, God caused the enemy to be thrown into confusion so that the battle was won by his intervention and not by the might of Israel's army. Often, when we are simply trusting God in our daily lives and praying for His guidance, we can look back and see how things have worked out not through anything we have done, but by some 'coincidental' event that we later recognize as the hand of God. May the long day on June 21st remind you that God holds you in the palm of His hand. Trust, pray and obey: do not be afraid, for He is with you always, to the very end of the age.

### **THE COVENANT, FUND RAISING AND OUR CHARITIES**

On Sunday, 26th April we held our Joint Covenant Anniversary Service with St Giles'. This year the service was held at the United Reformed Church; it is 30 years since the covenant was signed. The service was led by the Rector of St Giles', Revd Felicity Davies. She aptly summed up the aim of our covenant with the words, "Never do alone things that can be better done together".

This working together is exemplified by our joint Children's Holiday Club which will be in the first full week of the school summer holidays. All young children (primary school years 2-6) are welcome - watch out for details!

On 2nd May we held one of the several fund raising events organised by the URC each year. This one was a morning plant and book sale followed by a very popular auction of household items and collectables, which raised just over £2,000 for the church and our 2015 charities. For all but one of these events, we give half of the money taken to four different charities, chosen by our church members. This year we will be making donations to The London Air Ambulance, The National Autistic Society, The Barnabus Fund (which helps persecuted Christians worldwide) and St Mungo's Broadway (which gives practical help to homeless people as they try to rebuild their lives). At the end of the last year each of our four charities received a cheque for £607.

In the New Testament there are many examples of Jesus helping those with troubles - and in our own modest and humble way we must try to follow His example.

## 'HOLY MOWERS' REWARDED AFTER 25 YEARS

The dedicated team of gardeners who look after the St Giles' churchyard in Ickenham have been recognised for their efforts after 25 years. Affectionately called the 'Holy Mowers', they were taken completely by surprise when Ickenham Festival members David Edington and Alan Noad presented them with the coveted Swakeleys Shield; they had been led to believe they were simply going to have their photograph taken!

The Holy Mowers said they were, "completely surprised and had never expected anything like that". They said they found looking after the churchyard to be very rewarding and enjoyed working as a team and the fact that nobody tells them what to do!

The Swakeleys Shield has been awarded annually since 1986 for "Commitment to the Spirit of the Ickenham Festival". According to the citation accompanying the richly deserved award, "The 'Holy Mowers' have been lovingly tending the St Giles' churchyard every Tuesday, rain or shine, since their formation 25 years ago. The churchyard is an important place in Ickenham and is much used and appreciated by the public, whether of faith or not, passing through or just wishing to be in a place of tranquility".

The citation continues, “The team of volunteers are mostly well beyond retirement age but happily set about the weekly challenge of weeding, grass-cutting, strimming, pruning, planting and composting. The task is more demanding on account of the numerous graves set out over the centuries in a relatively random pattern but the Holy Mowers never complain and just get on with it.”

### CLICKRukiga UPDATE



Mike Whitlam (*on left*), Shirley Gledhill and Mark Morrish returned to Uganda in February to check on the current status of the charitable CLICKRukiga programmes supported by both churches, local groups and contributors throughout our community.

The trio was welcomed at **St James Church, Buhangizi**, where Mike preached a Sunday Sermon. They spent time with the St James Church project co-ordinator, Hillary Turyakira (liaison between the **Sponsored Children** families and UK sponsors), to ensure that the families were receiving benefit from the sponsorship money. Shirley met with several of the children’s families and visited their homes.

Notable improvements were apparent in the Girls Dormitory, Kitchen and Computer Room at **Kamwezi Parents Secondary School**. The flourishing link with Vyners School has led to funded

improvements to the water system and the school is applying for funds to help the development of Science and Literacy teaching. The **Kabale Women In Development (KWID)** project is setting up areas of land where they can grow crops and rear animals, including goats and pigs, and they are helping to support some particularly vulnerable families and children.

Senior Nurse Ann Moore, a 19-year veteran at the **Kisiizi Hospital**, plans to visit Ickenham in June. Her new-born baby unit needs more trained staff and two wards need improvements costing £15,000 each. She also helps at the newly established Nurse Training School at Kisiizi.

Mark undertook a comprehensive survey of the **Water Supply**, set up and financially supported by our donations, and discovered an absence of effective maintenance meant that some of the installed water taps were not receiving water. The team met Apollo, Chair of the Water Committee, and the issue is now being addressed. Hillary will ensure that progress continues. The team also met the Head Teacher of **The Brain Trust Primary School**, which is linked to Breakspear School. The productive visit will be repeated next year.

### **BISHOP PETE COMES TO BREAKFAST**

The Right Revd Pete Broadbent spoke about “Making a difference in our community” when he joined the Men’s Breakfast recently. On this special occasion a full English breakfast, prepared by the ‘Fresh Bite’ café, was served.

Our jovial Bishop started his talk by asking, “What is it like to be a man in church? Figures show that twice as many women as men attend church. Why the difference? According to the American author and relationship councillor, John Gray, who wrote the book ‘*Men are from Mars, Women are from Venus*’, most of common relationship problems between men and women result from fundamental psychological differences between the genders. Gray’s metaphor argues that each gender is acclimatised to its own society and customs, but not to those of the opposite gender, as if the two sexes come from different planets.”

The Bishop used the analogy to suggest that women may find church more inviting than men because women often find it easier to relate to each other, whereas men often prefer working solutions through on their own. “So we should find ways of making it easier for men to feel engaged with what goes on in church,” he said.

Bishop Pete challenged that there must be things we can do to attract attention of the local community so that when they ask, “Why are you doing that?” we say, “Because we are Christians.” We should engage more in local activities – let us be seen to be Christians. We should consider finding community speakers, both from within the church and outside. Tell audiences about the history of the church and give other people opportunities to speak in church or in the halls. “Let us rejoice in what we have together and delight in sharing it with others,” summarised Bishop Pete.

## DEDICATION OF THE NEW WOODEN CROSS

The new wooden cross mounted on the wall of the URC Church Hall is dedicated to the memory of Robert and Muriel Forrest, who each gave decades of faithful service as members of Ickenham URC. A memorial plaque was unveiled at the dedication on 12th April 2015, officiated by Anne Whitlam and attended by various Forrest family members and members of the URC congregation.

Robert (known as 'Bob') and Muriel came into Membership in 1962 and remained active church members until their deaths; Bob on 28th December 2006 and Muriel on 29th October 2012. Both contributed fully to the life of the church; Bob being the Church Treasurer for a while. They had many charitable interests, such as CWM (Christian World Mission) and the Bible-a-Month Club which Muriel supported and organised. Muriel was also a strong supporter of the Women's Fellowship and fundraising efforts such as the Christmas Fayre, but she and Bob always looked to the wider church and its needs in deprived areas.


Bob was a man of many parts. After retiring from a brilliant law career, he remained an honorary lecturer in International Air Law at UCL. He was a great craftsman and very good at constructing things such as model railways and dolls houses. He was also a stamp collector - and a writer. In 1998, Bob's book 'God Only Knows' was published, followed by a sequel in 2004. Both gave much food for thought. In Bob's own words, he was a "confirmed and equally unashamed Christian who has grown up in the faith, who has wrestled with its difficult areas and resolved them to my own satisfaction". Despite his many talents and great achievements Bob remained a quiet, modest man, remembered for his friendliness, humour, his love of God and his joyful anticipation of meeting Him "on the other side".

Although Muriel spent the latter part of her life living near her son in Bath, she still wished to remain on the membership roll of Ickenham URC. She attended church services on occasional visits to her daughter Margie in Ickenham, and enjoyed hosting tea parties for her old friends from the church.

Bob and Muriel are very fondly remembered by all of us who had the privilege to know them.
